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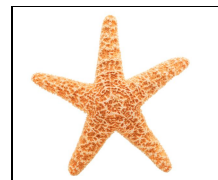

June Business Meeting Minutes

**Zonta Club of Everett - Business Meeting
June 5, 2008 - 7:30am
Everett Golf and Country Club**

Call to Order: The business meeting was called to order at 7:30 a.m. by President Isbell Juntilla. Special mention was given to our newest members, Diane Navicky (not present), Sonya Kraski (present), and Beverly Davis (not present). The club membership welcomes them!

Self Introductions and Z-lightful Dollars: Members introduced themselves and identified their professional/individual backgrounds. Z-lightful dollars were collected as members shared significant and recent events/accomplishments/celebrations. Tickets for the Raffle item, a box of Belgian Chocolates, were sold to those interested. Myrna Overstreet donated the Raffle item.

Announcements: President Isbell announced there is literature available regarding Zonta for members to take and have on hand for interested prospects. There were some available on a side table at this meeting.

Sunshine report: There were no reports today.

Club Discussion and Action:

Approval of May Business Minutes: After review of the Minutes a correction was made stating Chris Rommel gave the Program Report. Janice Henning Moved we approve the Minutes as amended. Judith Seconded the Motion and it was approved by the membership vote.

Approval of Treasurer's Report: President Isbell presented the Treasurer's Report in the absence of Treasurer Nancy Kniest. She explained there will be a corrected line item for the Forum next time. The balance for the current month was \$9,863.31. On the Foundation Report it was noted we have another "Just Book It" event's earnings to add into the total (\$731 for the yacht party). The Foundation Report showed \$9,863.31 savings for the current month. With the corrections noted, Janet Jolley Moved we accept the Treasurer's Report as presented. Janice Henning Seconded the Motion. The Motion passed.

Old Business:

Committee Assignments: The committee assignments for the 2008-09 year are completed. President Isbell will email this to members.

Year End Report: All committee chairs for the 2007-08 year need to have their summaries into Isbell ASAP. She will need to send them to the Governor on June 15th.

Governor's Seminar Planning: The Governor's Seminar will be hosted by the Everett Zonta Club September 11-13th. This was voted on by the membership and we agreed to all participate to make it a success. The next meeting is slated for June 13th at the Campfire Office. Members who have not yet signed up on a committee to help with this, need to do so ASAP, and attend planning meetings when possible. Judith Strand is coordinating the plans and needs/deserves our full support.

New Business:

July Business Meeting: In view of the fact the next Business Meeting would fall on July 3rd, it was decided to cancel it. It is so close to the 4th of July holiday plans for many, plus the International Convention in Rotterdam will have our President and others in attendance at that time. To compensate, the July 17th Luncheon Meeting will include Business and a report on Rotterdam (in lieu of another program).

January Business Meeting: President Isbell noted the scheduled Business Meeting would fall on January 1, 2009, and thus, would not be workable. Chris Rommel will touch base with EG&CC to confirm we could hold this meeting on January 8th instead.

Committee Reports:

Governor's Seminar/special committee: Judith Strand, coordinator of this project, reminded the membership it is a whole club event and everyone is expected to help. We voted to host this as a club and to host an excellent Seminar is important. She passed around a sign-up sheet for any members present who have not yet committed to an assignment.

Judith told members the theme will be "Dare to Dream" and in keeping with this, "Wizard of Oz" will be a focus. One task will be to create 130 Goody Bags. Members are asked to please be collecting items that would fit with the above theme/focus for the Goody Bags. We need actual bags that would be festive and appropriate. She emphasized rainbow colors will be used.

Status of Women/Service Committee: The new committee group will be meeting on July 8th in the afternoon at LaRae Tisdell's Camano Island home. The purpose will be to set goals and plan for the coming year.

Advocacy: Deborah Nedelman reported on the proposed Forum for 2009. It will be held on March 5th, 2009, to coordinate with International Women's Day, at the Lynnwood Convention Center. The format will include a Luncheon and speakers similar to this year's. It might be possible to include workshops as well. The proposed budget has been given to members to look over and consider. A concern over parking in the daytime was raised, and it will be checked out. The capacity is for 325, though the goal has been set for 300 attendees, and reflects in the proposed budget for that number. The ticket price was raised to \$35. After discussion it was determined to lower the ticket price to \$25 and add in the previous balance available for this event of approximately \$7800. The committee will bring back revisions to the budget at the next business meeting (July 17th at noon). Deborah also brought up the question of whether there should be a special sub-committee specifically for handling the Forum 2009. Discussion followed and opinions offered. One concern was there are an increasing number of meetings, verging on "too many." An opinion offered was this is really an Advocacy project and thus, the committee as a whole should assume responsibility of seeing the project through. The committee will discuss this idea further when they meet.

Auction: Norlonna Funkhouser reviewed the recent "Kick-off" held in conjunction with a social night at Erickson Furniture. It was well attended and packets for individual members were distributed. Those members who have not received theirs can do so by contacting the committee co-chairs. All solicitations and cash donations need to first be given to Patty Lervick who will enter the data in the

computer. There is still a need for Table Captains. The next meeting will be on Tuesday, June 10th at CBW, 6:00 p.m. This will be the last meeting until September. Jean Ann French elaborated on the idea of having a General Store. Attendees could purchase tickets for \$25 and exchange them for an item there. She explained it would be a good place for those items between \$25 and \$50 that do not fit in a basket. Discussion followed on how this would actually work, in terms of drawing a number that would either give the person their place in getting to select an item, or, numbers could be matched to specific items, which is more of a "grab bag" idea. Jean Ann also discussed the Ground Package for 2 to Hawaii she has received as a donation. The same source has also offered a 10% rebate to Zonta if a member purchases travel arrangements through them, which would apply ONLY to COMMISSIONABLE costs (not airfare). It would be a passive fundraiser somewhat like Goodsearch, and this would be on the members' only website for our access. The potential monies earned would be delegated to Foundation funds. After discussion Suzanne Popema Moved we accept the offer, and Cynthia Weaver Seconded the Motion. The Motion passed.

Finance: Susan Zakos and Jean Cooley McKay are co-chairs for the Finance Committee and will help conduct the annual audit.

Membership: The next meeting for Membership committee will be next Thursday at 5:15 held at the Campfire Office.

Program: Chris Rommel announced the guest speaker for the June

18th Program Meeting will be Bridget Cooley. Her topic will focus on changing careers after 40. Her personal experience led her to her true calling, which is an inspiring story. She had always dreamed of becoming an astronaut, and though that didn't happen, her love of flying did materialize into something wonderful. The next Program Committee meeting will be held on the 18th at Chelseas's Place, 7:30.

Public Relations: Diane Wright will be chairing this committee. Helen Kendall will continue her coverage of the website, and Melleny Thomasson has taken over as editor of the "Zontagram."

Other Business:

Raffle and Adjournment: Isbell Juntilla was the lucky winner of the Belgian Chocolates offered in the Raffle. With business concluded, the meeting was adjourned by President Isbell at 9:00 a.m.

Can the Spam Part II: Do You BCC?

And now the moment you've been waiting for – your second tip in the series on how to forward email properly, without propagating spam.

TIP #2:

Whenever you send an e-mail to more than one person, do NOT use the To: or Cc: fields for adding e-mail addresses. **Always use the BCC: (blind carbon copy) field for listing the e-mail addresses.** This way, the people you send to will only see their own e-mail address.

If you don't see your BCC: option,

click on where it says To: and your address list will appear. Highlight the address and choose BCC: and that's it: it's that easy.

When you send to BCC, your message will automatically say 'Undisclosed Recipients' in the 'TO:' field for the people who receive it. This means that spam-happy recipients can't see everyone else you sent the message to, and they can't spam all those innocent bystanders.

Constructive Forgetting

Constructive forgetting can help you remember important matters

Scientists have discovered that when you want to remember a fact, the prefrontal cortex of the brain becomes very busy. It has to sort through a lot of irrelevant information.

Once it has edited out all the clutter, the prefrontal part of the brain is free to do more important things, such as make decisions.

Thomas Cook, CEO of Cognitive Research Corp., says one of his favorite prescriptions for better memory is "knowing what and when to forget." Quoted in *Prevention*, he says our daily overload of information is just filled with too much stuff. He recommends:

- For appointments, meeting dates, birthdays, and events, list them on your calendar so you won't have to keep them in mind.
- Keep telephone numbers, even for family members, stored in your cell phone, computer, or on an easily accessible paper list.
- When reading the newspaper, decide to remember only what is important to you.
- At a meeting or party, learn only the names of people you want to see again.
- Block unpleasant memories. Lingering memories of childhood trauma, emotional rejection, or workplace slight can interfere with mental sharpness.

When such a memory rises, replace it immediately with a happy one. Remember a joyful time in detail and try to relive it. Without reinforcement, the unpleasant memory will fade into a distant corner of your mind.

These steps could lead you toward brain fitness and a greater ability to remember what you need to know.
